SecondFirst Church will be hosting a movie "Join or Die" in partnership with Rockford Urban Ministries, tentatively set for Aug 25, time TBD. Watch for posters!!

Join or Die is an important documentary on America's social fabric. It was enthusiastically received at its world premiere at the SXSW Film Festival. It takes the theories of Professor Bob Putnam, author of 'Bowling Alone', and presents them in a highly accessible way. Putnam's argument is essentially that Americans divisions today are rooted in the decline of our social capital as fewer Americans join clubs and organizations.

While some disagree with his thesis fearing he may be mixing cause and effect, it is an important debate and one with which the American public should be more engaged. The documentary is well worth watching. The film makers have done an excellent job of taking a complex academic debate and making it accessible and available.
