If you don't have a card at home, there will be some available for you to use. Becky's time with us has been nurturing and fruitful and we cannot thank her enough for her faithful ministry.

ONA Task Force Update: Last week's information session discussed the various ways that humans determine how a person is identified as male or female. Briefly, there are 4 general ways: by examination of external and/or internal anatomy, by examination of chromosomes, and by measuring hormones such as testosterone and estrogen. We spent a lot of time on the chromosomes because even though having two X chromosomes (female) or one X and one Y

(male) are typical for our species, there are many more possibilities, some of which have significant effects on the person. Even when measuring hormones, most males have higher levels of testosterone than most females for example but there is much variation in range that complicates things. Biology is complicated. There will be a second session on this topic on Sunday, April 6, in which we will focus on what it means to have a sense of self and a gender identity. You are welcome to attend even if you missed the first session.
