As a minister ordained by the PC(USA), Rev. Martha will work to complete requirements to achieve dual standing in the UCC upon starting her position at our church.

Rev. Martha has demonstrated experience across all areas needed to successfully serve as our Senior Pastor. Administratively, Rev. Martha is organized and likes to work in a collaborative style. She believes in forthright communication and transparent decision-making. As a spiritual leader, she says, "At the heart of ministry, preaching and teaching are bedrock skills that draw upon my passion for clarity and deep engagement with the biblical text. I bring a pastor's heart which holds it a privilege to journey with the community through the heights and depths of life together."Rev. Martha credits a threeyear program in Spiritual Direction in augmenting her skills in helping churches to discern new ventures and create strategic plans. In addition, this training has helped her to work with people who are experiencing grief.


